 This Indenture made the twenty third day of November in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine between William Choice Esquire, Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District, at Greenville C.H. in the said State, of the one part, and John Hodges of the other part. Whereas John Hodges & wife Susan Bradley, W. Shrimshire & wife Elener Merritt, Lazarus Jones & wife and William Parker and wife on or about the tenth day of May A.D. 1827 did Exhibit their Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State, against Wheaton Merritt Administrator of Benjamin Merritt stating among other things that they are the Heirs at Law of the said Benjamin Merritt; that he departed this life some years since Intestate seized and possessed of a valuable real Estate and
