John Whitt of the State aforesaid and District of Anderson do and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Samuel Williams of the State and District aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel Williams a tract or parcel of land containing forty one acres more or less situate lying and being in Greenville district on the golden Grove Creek waters of Saluda River Beginning at a Stake 3x on the S.W. bank of Grove Creek thence N. 85. W. 6 to a Stake 3x thence N. 5. E. 7 ~~50~~ to a Stake 3x thence N. 5. E. 7 W. 12. 80. to a Post Oak 3x on Maxwell's old line thence N. 20. E. 18 along said line to Maxwell's black oak corner on layd line thence S. 70. E. 14. 50 to a Spanish oak near the bank of the said Grove thence the remainder of the said Creek to the beginning together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
