



Recorded in the Grant book A.A.A.A. Page 57 thence conveyed from

 to the mouth of said Spring branch thence up the meanders of said
 Spring branch to the beginning, in Ceding one hundred and five acres
 be the same more or less and including, the house and plantation where the
 said Ramsey now live, Together with all and singular the rights, members
 hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said Premises belonging or in
 any wise Incident or appertaining To Have and to hold all and
 singular the premises, before mentioned unto the said Alexander
 Peden Sir his heir, and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself
 my heirs and Executors and administrators to warrant and for ever de-
 fend all and singular the said premises unto the said Alexander Peden
 Sir his heir and assigns for ever against myself and my heirs and agai-
 -not every person claiming the same or any part thereof Witness our
 hands and seals this sixth day of January in the Year of our
 Lord One Thousand eight hundred and thirty and in the fifty
 fourth Year of the American Independence signed sealed
 and delivered in the presence of } Samuel Ramsey

 or less of land lying in said District on a branch of the Rudy
 Fork of Rudy River being part of a tract of land granted
