W. 58. @ 150 links to a stake David Forrest's corner thence a conditional line straight from said stake to the head of the branch at the beginning thence down the said branch to the beginning containing by Estimation one hundred and seventy acres be the same more or less together with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident to have and to hold all and singular the premises as before mentioned unto the said James Pickett his heirs and assigns forever, and we do bind our selves our heirs Executors administrators and assigns to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the above mentioned premises unto the said James Pickett and his heirs against our selves and our heirs and against all other persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof as witness hereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this 24 day of December in the year of our Lord A.D. 1829. and 53 of American Independence signed and acknowledged in the presence of us it being the tract of land sold by William & Mary Lynch 2^d June 1821. in witness of us.
