The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that we William Nash Miles Nash and Jobner Nash of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid, for and in Consideration of the sum of thirteen hundred and thirteen & 30/100 Dollars to us paid, by James Nash of the same place, Have granted, bargained, bargain'd, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said James Nash, all that parcel or tract of land containing One hundred and thirty One and one third acres more or less situate in the State & District aforesaid, lying on the west side of South Reborns Creek beginning on a Stake 3+ on the creek, and running thence S 51 W 39. to a tied Oak 3+ bounded by John M. Harrison's land, thence S 37. E 41. 50 to a stake 3+ bounded by Moses W. Peden's land thence nearly East down a small branch that leads near the line to where it empties into mill pond, bounded by Jobner Nash's land, thence up the meadows of the creek to the beginning. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances therein same belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining. We the said William Nash his heirs and assigns forever, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs & assigns and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend and singular the said premises unto the said James Nash, his heirs and assigns, against ourselves and our heirs. Witness our hands and seals this the 4th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven Signed sealed and delivered by William Nash Miles Nash Jobner Nash in presence of Moses W. Peden Warren Mappes

South Carolina Personally Came before me Moses W. Peden and Greenville District of South on Oath that he saw William Nash Miles Nash & Jobner Nash assign the above deed of conveyance & deliver it to James Nash for the use and purpose therein mentioned and that he saw Warren Mappes sign as a witness with himself Sworn to and subscribed this 2nd day of March 1838.
