

Isaac Roberts } Deed of Sale for 350 acres of Land

To David Roberts } The State of South Carolina } Know all men by these presents that I Isaac Roberts of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid in consideration of Fifteen Hundred Dollars to me paid in hand by David Roberts of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said David Roberts all that tract of Land situate lying and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on the head waters of Peedy Fork Creek of Peedy River containing three hundred and fifty acres more or less, being a tract of Land originally granted to William Brasher by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq Governor of South Carolina on the fourth day of December 1786. Bounded by Lands of James Seaborn William Cotton and Herychiah Cochrum, together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said David Roberts his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said David Roberts his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand and seal this the fifteenth July A.D. 1842.
