I know all men by these presents that I Elizabeth Callaway
of the State of South Carolina, and the District of
Greenville have bargained & sold unto William Cox
for the sum of fifty dollars paid, a certain tract or
parcel of Land in the State & District above said containing by estimation
fifty acres more or less, lying on the small branches of Rock Creek and,
bounded as follows on the east west by George Holcomb's land and passing
his lines till it intersects Allen's lands thence with his lines to a certain point
which will correspond with a cross fence which is a continual line
between said land and Soalfe's land thence from said point to the said
fence & to pursue the fence to the corner, thence from the corner of the
fence making a right angle west till it intersects a small branch
thence along said branch to its source, thence from the source of said
branch in a direct line until it intersects Spiggs line, thence with
his lines I land till they intersect Holcomb's lands - The said William
Cox his heirs and assigns, To Have and to Hold the said land premises
from the said Elizabeth Callaway & her heirs, and from all and every other
person or persons from having or laying any just right, title or claim
thereon forever, witness my hand & Seal this second day of October
eighteen hundred & thirty three, Signed, Sealed and delivered in
the presence of, Jno Stewart

these presents that I Peter Cauble of Greenville District in the State
of South Carolina aforesaid, in consideration of the natural love & affection
I have towards my children, William
Cauble, Jane Cauble & Henry Cauble, and
for divers other good causes, considerations, have this day given, granted
& confirmed, and by these presents do give, grant & confirm unto them
the said William, Jane & Henry the following Negro Slaves, to wit,
I give unto the said William A. Cauble a negro girl called Hannah
to have, hold & enjoy the said Negro girl Hannah, to his own proper
use & behoof to his heirs, administrators & assigns forever. I also hereby
give unto Jane Cauble a certain negro girl named Marta, to
have and to hold the said girl Marta to her own use & behoof and
to her executors, administrators & assigns forever. I also hereby give
unto Henry A. Cauble a negro girl called Henrietta have and to
