land, South by Mrs. Townes, E. East by P. Hobbes land and Eastward by the Estate of
G. J. Allison, and hath such form as a plat thereof annexed to a deed from J. W. H.
Blasingame to Eliza A. Simkins dated 12th Sept 1834, represents. And which tract
was conveyed to me the said W. C. Anderson on the 29th December 1838 by P. W.
Pickens Executor of the Said Eliza A. Simkins deceased. Together with all &
