 Know all men by these presents that Willis Parcuport, in consideration of seventy two dollars and seventy five cents, hath bargained, sold and delivered, and by these presents doth bargain sell and in open market deliver unto William Avery, one set of stills, consisting of two stills, 14 tubs, 34 tight Casks unto the said William Avery, his executors, administrators and assigns forever, Provided nevertheless and it is expressly agreed, between the said parties that if the said Willis Parcuport, his Executors or admors shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto William Avery his certain Attorney, Executors, administrators or assigns, the full sum of \$72.75 on or before the 25th day of December next, then the above bill of Sale or Mortgage, and every article, and thing therein contained shall cease & be utterly void or else remain in full force & virtue, Given under my hand and seal this 25th March 1843-

 To, all to whom these presents shall come, I, William M. Goodlett Sheriff of Greenville District and State aforesaid, send greeting, where

as by virtue of sundry writs of fieri facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held for the District of Greenville, one tested the seventh day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty one at the suit of S. Turner, to me directed commanding me that of the goods & chattles, lands & tenements of Charles Garrison to levy the sum of three hundred & seventy six & 2/100 dollars damages and costs, I have seized & taken of the lands and tenements of the said Charles Garrison, all that piece parcel & tract of Land containing more or less two hundred acres, situate and being in the District of Greenville on the west side of Iron Creek and east side of Saluda River (in the fork) also sixty two acres adjoining the above tract, Doct W^m Jovis land, et al - And whereas the said premises, with their appurtenances, since the seizure by me made by virtue of the said writs of fieri facias before mentioned, have been exposed to sale at public vendue and purchased by P. W. Kimman of the District & State aforesaid
