E 54.00 to a stake 3x bounded by George Gambrell thence S 47 E 11.75 to a stone corner bounded by the said George Gambrell thence N 52 E 32.00 to a dog-wood 3x bounded by Mr Nabors thence N 42 W 24.10 to a stake 3x thence S 48 W 34.00 to a stake 3x thence N 0 47 W 29.00 to a hickory 3x thence S 31 W 41.50 to a Chinquapin 3x on the river thence down the meanders of the same to the beginning. The smaller tract situate and lying on the waters of Mountain Creek beginning on a hickory 3x and running thence S 13 W 38.25 to a stone 3x bounded by John McCulloughs land, thence N 47. W 9.80. to a hickory 3x bounded by Nathaniel Barnes thence N 13 E 33.50 to a Red Oak 3x bounded by John McClock, thence S 75 E 8.10 to the beginning bounded by the said Joseph McCulloughs land.
