To all to whom these presents shall come:

I, William Mc Goodlett, Sheriff of

Grenville District and State aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereas, by virtue of  
Two Writs of Fieri Facias to me directed, issued out of the Court of  
Common Pleas, held for the District of Greenville on tenth the twentieth  
day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and forty-three at the suit of Robt. Cox, commanding me, that of the  
goods and chattels, lands and tenements of James E. Flack, to levy the  
sum of Fifty-Eight &  $\frac{85}{100}$  Dollars damages and costs, I have seized and  
taken of the lands and tenements of the said James E. Flack, all that  
certain piece, parcel and tract of Land, containing more or less one hundred and  
fifty Acres, situate and being in the District of Greenville, wherein the De-  
fendant now lives, adjoining lands of James H. Cleveland, W<sup>m</sup> Cox, Jr. et al.  
And whereas, the said premises, with their appurtenances, since the seizure by  
me made, by virtue of the said Writs of fieri facias before mentioned, have been  
exposed to sale at public vendue, and purchased by John Bates, Senior,  
of the District and State aforesaid, for the sum of Twenty-Six Dollars, be-  
ing the highest sum that was bidden therefor: Now know ye, that I, Wil-  
liam Mc Goodlett, Sheriff aforesaid, by virtue of the said Writs of fieri fa-  
cias aforesaid, to me directed and delivered as aforesaid, and by virtue of  
the Statute in such cases made and provided, and for and in considera-  
tion of the said sum of Twenty-Six Dollars to me in hand paid, or secured  
to be paid by the said John Bates, Jr., the receipt and payment whereof I do  
fully acknowledge, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do  
grant, bargain and sell unto the said John Bates, Jr. his heirs and assigns  
forever, the said tract, piece and parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, and all  
the estate, right, title and interest, which the said James E. Flack of right had,  
of, in, and to the same. To have and to hold, the said piece, parcel and tract  
of land, with its appurtenances, unto the said John Bates, Jr. his heirs and  
assigns forever, as fully and absolutely as I, the said W. M. Goodlett, Sheriff  
aforesaid, might, could, or ought to grant, bargain and sell the same, by  
virtue of the Statute aforesaid, and the said writs of fieri facias or otherwise.
