To all to whom these presents shall come. I, William M. Goodlett, Sheriff of Greenville District and State aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereas, by virtue of sundry Writs of Fieri Facias, issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for the District of Greenville, on the twenty-fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three at the suit of William Choise, to me directed, commanding me, that of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements, of James Sidley, to levy the sum of Four hundred and thirty & 1/100 Dollars damages and costs, I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of the said James Sidley all that certain piece, parcel and tract of land, containing more or less one hundred and seventy-five Acres, situate and being in the District of Greenville on the waters of Souths Sacolet River, and known as Perry Page tract, adjoining a tract sold to Col.
