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South Carolina, Know all men by these  
Greenville District, parents, that I, John Cooper,

of the District of Greenville in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Hugh Mc Gowan in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Hugh Mc Gowan, all that tract or parcel of Land containing Forty Five Acres, more or less, situated in said District on the waters of Saluda River, it being the same tract sold and conveyed by John Mc Roberts and Henry Teal to the said John Watson, bearing date the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1840, and hath such bounds, marks, &c. as follows, (viz.) Beginning at a stake 3<sup>x</sup> in John Shepperd's land near the public road, running thence N. 48 E. 17 chs. to a bunch of Poplars in a fork of Mill Creek, thence down said Creek to include any or all the land that may be covered by any Dam that now or may be hereafter erected at the School, next below where Lynn Watson erected a Saw mill nearly to the junction of the said Fork with the other Fork of Mill Creek, thence South 70 W. 70 chs.
