thousand eight hundred and forty five between J. J. Quisten Esquire, Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville district, at Greenville C. H. in the said State, of the one part, and Peter Cauble of the other part:

H. in the said State, against Miles Sutherland and Wife, C. Wellingham & wife, and others, praying for Partition of the Real Estate of said W. Crowder, dead, also for Relief, &c. And the Cause, being at issue before the Honorable Court, came on to be heard at June Term, when the said Court, after full hear-
