Whereas, by virtue of a Writ

To have and to hold the said piece, parcel and tract of land, with its appurtenances, unto the said Mrs. Ann Earle her heirs and assigns forever, as fully and absolutely as I the said David Hoke Sheriff might, could, or ought to grant, bargain and sell the same, by virtue of the statute aforesaid, and the said Writ of fieri facias or otherwise.
