 these presents do give grant bargain sell and convey unto the said William Butler
 his heirs forever a certain tract a parcel of land situated in Greenville District
 near Pikes mountain Containing Fifty acres more or less and hath such shape an
 bounds acres as are particularly set forth in a deed of Conveyance executed
 by Mary Pike to myself on the twentieth day of May One Thousand eight hundred
 and twenty eight

To have and to hold all and singular the said premises together
 with the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any
 wise appertaining unto the said William Butler his heirs and assigns forever
 and do hereby bind myself and my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant
 and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William Butler
 and his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs and against every other
 person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
