have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain and release unto the said Wm. Thompson his heirs and assigns all that Tract of Land containing Two hundred and Thirty Six and one half acres more or less situated in the County of Richland in the State of South Carolina, beginning at a stone corner running S 45 E 43 chs to a small  
stone corner Thence W 45 N 55 chs to a stone corner Thence W 45 E 43 chs to a small  
creek Thence S 45 E 55 chs to the beginning corner as the first boundary corner, but which represents together with all and singular the boundaries, rights, members and appurtenances  
whatsoever to the said Tract of Land belonging or in anywise appertaining thereto the cessions and  
assignments and profits thereof and also all the estate title or estate interest there possessed  
by any person or persons whatever in the said Tract of Land and in Equity of the same and  
representations of the said Alexander Stearn and of all the parties to this writing of all  
persons rightfully claiming to claim the same or any part thereof by claim or under color  
of title to them. It shall and is held the said Tract of Land with its boundaries from time  
and appurtenances unto the said Wm. Thompson to Esq. his heirs and assigns to his and their  
use as long as and so long as
