Whitten of Tappah County State of Mississippi of the Cowan in the premises described in and from the said Silas R. Whitten of said County and State to James M. Makin of Greenville District State of South Carolina dated the eighteenth day of October One Thousand Eight Hundred and fifty one conveying a Tract of Land containing Twelve hundred and fifty acres more or less situated and being in Greenville District South Carolina on both sides of South Packholts River and also on both sides of North and South Green Creeks for the consideration of Five Thousand Dollars and for this purpose you will cause the said Mrs. Elanah Whitten to appear before you and you will examine her privately and separately apart from the persons and if upon such examination she shall declare that she does freely and voluntarily and without any compulsion dread or fear of any persons or persons whose names whenever release and forever relinquish to the said James M. Makin his heirs and assigns all his interest and estate and also all his right and claim of Cowan of her and to all and singular the premises described and conveyed and conveyed in the said deed and that you shall take under your hand a certificate of the said declaration as aforesaid in the form of a declaration upon private examination as aforesaid which certificate authenticated by your hands and seals the due execution of this deed and transfer the same by the oath of one of your before some Magistrate who is authorized by the laws of your State to administer an oath and whose official signature may be properly authenticated You shall carefully return this deed together with your proceedings thereon to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions for Greenville District in the State first aforesaid to the duly recorded Henricus fac not Wm.
