You shall annex to this writ, and having certified under your hands and seals, the due execution of this writ and received the same by the oath of one of you before some Magistrate, who is authorized by the Law of your State, to administer an oath, and whose official signature, may be properly authenticated. You shall carefully return this writ together with your proceedings, to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions for Greenville District in the State of South Carolina to be duly recorded.
