bargain and other causes and considerations me thinkable money and goods and necessaries  
have given and conveyed to the said J. S. Wrigge I have given and conveyed  
to him \$5000000 by these presents do give and convey unto the said J. S. Wrigge all the  
32. Shares in my Land containing 894 acres more or less Beginning at a postmark  
15 N 24 E 25 S going below the Mill dam on Golden Creek and down said Creek to mouth  
to a stream New Pinetree Creek, up mouth of Branch then up said Branch to Long Peppar Creek  
of one hundred & 37 A. S. I take of them on S. W. side of a spring on Long Branch then down said Branch  
the Eastern branch of same, a branch, then up said branch to Long Peppar Creek 34 Acres At 23% Ad  
dam from 100 to large Hettney then down said branch to ash creek then to Golden Creek at  
base then south of branch then crossing Creek to Gun Creek Then At 24% Ad 48.62 to a stream 34  
acres now in Gun Creek at Golden Creek At 29 Ad 3.00 to Ad 0.50 on Stony Branch At 26% Ad  
12.50 Ad 0.34 Then over Ad 33.6 20.00 Ad 44.4 Ad 56.25 h. Stake 54 \$56.44 p. per acre

I do further declare that the said Land I having  
the year and then increase over to be held in high hand employed for the sole use  
and benefit of my son Jesse Wrigge and his family free from any  
large proportion doubt during his life and at his death to be equally divided  
among his legate children, that may survive him and the children of  
any that may die before him representing their parents And of my son Jesse Wrigge  
I give them to die leaving neither child a child nor descendants who shall  
be until they are thirty years of age then and in that case the said Land  
no slaves over than sixteen to be turned back to my Estate This further if  
possibly understood and provided by these presents that should any of the aforesaid  
day of slaves, said my said Son Jesse Wrigge the said J. S. Wrigge shall have full  
power to sell such slave or slaves as may not suit, then and in that case  
shall purchase others with the money and substitute them as in like manner as  
said

I do further declare that the said J. S. Wrigge live on the premises aforesaid

one inconvenient distance from each other in any thing should happen to make  
it inconvenient for him to act as Trustee My said Son Jesse Wrigge shall  
have full power to select another Trustee in this place It is expressly understood  
that the said slaves with their increase aforesaid to be removed over 30 Miles  
in any and proper without the consent and approbation of the Trustee and  
of my son Jesse Wrigge nothing my Trustee said shall this power
