I now witness by these presents that George Miller a man of color of the District and State of
and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and Sixty dollars in hand paid by my brother Samuel Stokes (a colored man) sometimes called Sam'l Rains of the same District and State aforesaid have bargained sold and released and by these presents do bargain sell and release unto the said Sam'l Stokes all that tract of land wherein I have been living and which my Father did contain six acres and a half being a part of the tract of land conveyed to my said Father (from Stokes by William Taylor died bearing date 28th October 1828 as recorded in the Office of Deed Conveyance in the District and State aforesaid in Book D pages 304 & 305)

Together with all the Rights Members Chattelments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining thereto
Do hereby warrant and forever discharge the Right Title of the above named land to the said Sam'l Stokes alias Sam'l Rains his heirs and assigns from me against myself my heirs and assigns and against every and all persons claiming to claim the same or any part thereof.
