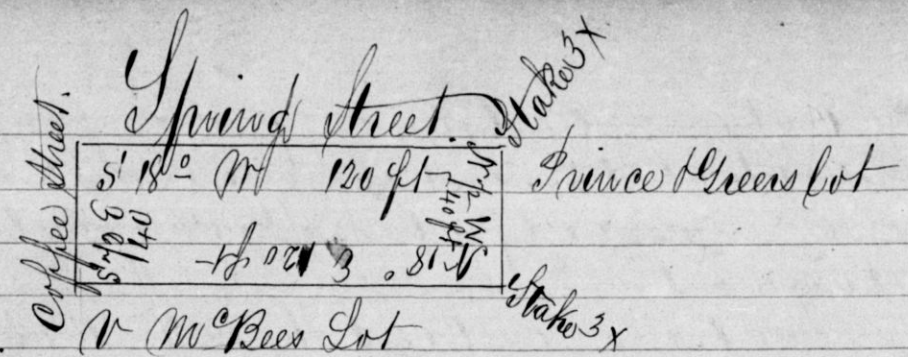

402* South Carolina. Greenville District. I, Francis Mahon

Whereas Francis Mahon has by an unfortunate occurrence lost the sight of his eyes, and is thereby unable to perform any labor by which to gain a support. Know all men by these presents, that I, Garding M'Pee in consideration of his melancholy and helpless condition & the sum of One dollar, have this day granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Francis Mahon, a certain piece or parcel of Land, situate in the North Eastern part of the village of Greenville being part of a lot described on the village plan, as lot No 22. Bounding at the corner of Coffee and Spring streets and runs thence with Spring street S 18° N 120 ft to a stake 3x corner of a lot now owned by Prince Green, and runs as a stable lot thence with their line N 72° N 40 feet to a stake 3x thence N 18° E 120 ft to a stake 3x, on Coffee street. Thence with said street S 72° E 40 feet to the beginning corner. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all the premises before mentioned unto the said Francis Mahon, his heirs and assigns forever - and I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, & Executors & Administrators, to warrant and forever defend all the premises before mentioned unto the said Francis Mahon his heirs & assigns, against myself, my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.

I, Samuel A. Jones, C. E. & S. D. of the State of South Carolina, do hereby certify that the within deed was duly recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds for the County of Greenville, South Carolina, on the 16th day of October, 1858.

This Indenture made the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five (1855), between Samuel A. Jones Esquire, Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House, in the said state, of the one part, and Benjamin Gass of the other part: Whereas Araminta J. Westfield, David H. Westfield, her husband and others, on or about the 28th day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five exhibited their Bill of complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said state against Edward H. Stokes and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court, came on to be heard at the July Term, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, when the said Court, after full hearing thereof, and mature deliberation in the premises did Order, Adjudge and decree that the Lands described in said Bill should be sold at Public Auction, by the Commissioner of the said Court, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their Secretal order, as by reference thereto in the ledgers of the said Court will appear, and the said Samuel A. Jones, as Commissioner of the said Court, after having duly advertised the said Lands for sale, by Public outcry on the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, did then openly and publicly, and accord
