 and forty acres on the first day of January 1787 Recorded in
 grant Book P. P. P. page 578 thence conveyed to S. Sullivan Now
 from Sullivan to S. Rea part of the tract Beginning on a poplar on
 the side of the Creek running thence S. W. 50.43 ch 50 huts to a stake
 thence along the original line S. 40 E. 23 ch to a stake thence N. 50 E.
 48 to a Old or Bush on the Creek thence up the Creek with its meanders
 to the beginning including the plantation when Mr. Cook now lives to
 gether with one hundred acres of land be the same more or less
 situate in the State and District aforesaid on Horse Creek waters of
 Reedy River Together with all and singular rights members
 hereditaments and appurtenances to said premises belonging or in any
 wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular
 the premises before mentioned unto the said John Rea his heirs and
 assigns forever and I do hereby bind my self my heirs executors and
 administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said
 premises unto the said John Rea his heirs and assigns against myself
 and my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully

 unto said Sully Bolling a plantation and a part of a tract of land granted
 to John Denning for six hundred and forty acres of land on the first
 day of January 1787 recorded in grant Book P. P. P. page 578 thence
 conveyed to Clayburn Sullivan thence from S. Sullivan to John Rea
 thence from said Rea to Sully Bolling part of a tract of land beg-
 ining on a Poplar on the side of the Creek running thence S. W. 50
 43.50 to a stake thence along the original line S. 40 E. 22 to a stake thence
 N. 50 E. 48 to a Old or Bush on the Creek thence up the Creek with its mean-
 ders to the beginning including the plantation when said Rea now
 lives. Together with one hundred acres of land be the same more or
 less. Situated in the State and District aforesaid on Horse Creek waters
 of river. Together with all and singular rights members hereditam-
 ents and appurtenances to said premises belonging or in any
 wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and sing-
 ular the premises before mentioned unto said Sully Bolling his heirs
 and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind my self my heirs and
 executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all
 and singular the said premises unto the said Sully Bolling his heirs
 and assigns against my self and my heirs and against every other
 person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any
 part thereof witness my hand and seal this 3rd November 1826 and in
 the 50th & 51st year of the Independence of the united States of America
