Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to me paid I have this day granted bargain sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said L. J. Waddle his heirs and assigns forever all that tract of Land containing Two hundred and twenty eight acres and one half, Except 50 ft. around or 50 ft north 50 ft East 50 ft South & fifty feet west to include the present Grave yard, more or less it being a tract of Land originally granted to Jesse Dunkin situated in said District on Saluda River and hath such bounds marks & as follows Viz Beginning at a chinquapin on said River thence 170 & 23.50 to an S. R. 3+ thence South 26 & 39.70 ch to a stake 3+ thence 140 W 21.20 ch to a Spanish oak 3+ thence 40 W 1.50 to a stake 3+ thence 186 W 28.25 to a pine, thence N 55 to 20 ch to a white oak on said River thence by the meanderings up, and of said River to the beginning corner a more fully description of which may be had by reference to a plat annexed to a deed made by John Watson ordinary of said District to Charles Garrison and by reference to plat of L. Long, reference to that sale bill will show two mares or their proceeds the stock cattle Hogs Sheep &c, that I bought of them on the 23^d October 1858 & sundries other articles reference to a sale bill then made our will fully show, To have and to hold all the above property in trust as before stated for the sole & separate use & behoof of my said daughter Elizabeth during her life & at her death the above mentioned property to be held to her children to be divided agreeable to the statutes of distribution. The said Thomas L. Fowler in trust as aforesaid is hereby granted liberty to sell or trade any of the above property or use it to reinvest the sales of said in other property to be held in like trust except the girl Winny, the sale of her I prohibit & her increase.
