Between William Mc Thomas Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House in the State of the one part and Peter G Charles of the other part whereas Clarinda McCullough on or about the seventh day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight exhibited her bill of complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State against P G Charles and Mary A Charles S W Beard and Emma S Beard Joseph Mc McCullough James L McCullough Louisa Mc McCullough Harriett Mc McCullough David S McCullough John W McCullough and Charles L McCullough for partition and sale of the lands of David McCullough deceased, and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Chambers Room in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the said lands should be sold at public Auction by the Commissioner of the said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their decretal order as by reference thereto in the registry of the said Court will appear and the said Samuel A Towns as Commissioner of the said Court after having duly advertised the said lands for sale by Public Auction on the third day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine did then openly and publicly and according to the custom of Auctions sell and dispose of the said lands below described unto the said Peter G Charles for six hundred dollars being at that price the highest bidder for the same. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said William Mc Thomas as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said Decree, and in consideration of the sum of six hundred Dollars paid him by the said Peter G Charles the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and released unto the said Peter G Charles his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of Land Situate on the head branches of Needy South Fork waters of Saluda River adjoining lands of David McCullough estate now and by Warkdale Charles containing two hundred and fifty four acres more or less and having the following miles and bounds commencing at a lightwood stake in the Needy land running thence S 79 W 1/4 to a stake 37 on thence N 6 1/2 W 57 60 to a stake 37 on N 85 E 15 along W H Road to a stake thence N 78 0 4 1/2 to a stake 37 on thence N 28 E 59 to a stake 37 on thence N 88 W 52.25 to the beginning corner being a tract sold by J of Curston to David McCullough
