To J. W. Parrish, A. R. Craddock and James Pools of Marshall County in the State of Mississippi speaking know ye that in consideration of your integrity and skill full power is hereby given to you or to any two or more of you to take the acknowledgment of Mary Ann Dickey wife of E. O. Dickey in the State of Mississippi of her dower in the premises described in the deed heretofore annexed dated the 23rd day of March A. D. 1867 concerning a tract of land containing one hundred and fifty acres and three fourths acres more or less situated in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina for this purpose you will cause the said Mrs Mary Ann Dickey to appear before you and you will examine her privately and separately apart from other persons and if upon such examination she shall freely declare that she does freely voluntarily and without any compulsions dread or fear of any persons whatsoever renounce release and forever relinquish to Isaac L. Gowan his heirs and assigns all her interest and title and also all her right and claim of Power of in and to all and singular the premises described and conveyed in the deed aforesaid then you shall take under your hands a certificate of her renunciations as aforesaid in the form of a declaration upon private examination as aforesaid which certificate authenticated by your hands and seals you shall annex to this writ and having certified under your hands and seals the due execution of this writ and verified the same by the oath of one of you before a Justice of the Peace who is duly sworn by the laws of your state to administer an oath and whose official signature may be properly authenticated you shall carefully return this writ together with your proceedings thereon to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions for Greenville County in the state aforesaid to be duly recorded herein said Justice W. A. McManis of the Court of Common Pleas and General Sessions for Greenville County in the State of South Carolina on the 19th day of June A. D. 1869

Smith for agricultural purposes not to exceed fifty Dollars during the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy one the said J. C. Smith hereby agrees to give unto the said J. F. Donalds as aforesaid a lien for the amount which shall be so advanced with the interest thereon at the rate of ten per centum per annum on all the crops of whatsoever description he may grow or cause to be grown during the year aforesaid but
