F. Lowmes to James W. Randolph being the same lot or parcel of land that was conveyed to the said Dudley Lally by deed of John W. Pickett bearing date the 21 st day of November 1867 & recorded in the office of the Register of Meem Conveyance for Greenville County Book A A page 563 and is in said deed more particularly described and set forth after my death to have and to hold the said lot of land to the said Mourning Lally and Harriet Anderson to them during their lives with power on their part or either of them by deed or will to dispose of their share or interest & estate in said lot and should no such disposition be made by them or either of them then the part not disposed of or the whole of said lot in case no part of the same shall have been conveyed or devised then the whole of said lot or such part as may not have been disposed of as the case may be shall descend and go to the lawful issue of the said Harriet Anderson living at her death and their heirs forever the issue of a deceased child to take the part which the parent would be entitled if living and if no such lawful issue be living at the death of the said Harriet Anderson then the said lot shall revert to the estate of me the said Dudley Lally. Shelor and Warren R. Shelor of Oconee County in the State aforesaid at my special instance and request have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William H. Perry, all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in Greenville County in the State aforesaid on North Saluda River and South Saluda River on which I now reside and of which I now have possession, containing one thousand acres more or less and consisting originally of two tracts of land, the first tract being the tract conveyed by Richard Young by Deed bearing date the twentieth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven and recorded in Register Meem Conveyance office for Greenville County Book I Page 354 containing three thousand acres more or less, situate lying and being in Greenville County State aforesaid on North Saluda River, the second tract being the tract hereunto to me by the will of my Father Robert B.
