McClary & James McCullough Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining thereto. To have & to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said James McCullough his heirs & assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs & assigns to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said James McCullough his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs & assigns or any other person whatsoever claiming the same.

Rector his heirs and assigns forever, and the State aforesaid does hereby bind itself to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises, unto the said Mat. Rector his heirs and assigns against all persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
