Westmoreland of Greenville Co in the State aforesaid, and further in consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars (Three hundred Dollars and interest thereon being for borrowed money and the balance for saw mill improvements) to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents, by J. P. Westmoreland of Fulton County in the State of Georgia (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. P. Westmoreland all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid about fourteen miles North of Greenville Court House, on what is known as the Old Ponce de Leon Road and the Greenville Road, and adjoining lands of P. C. Westmoreland, Archie Mitchell and others and having the following notes and bounds to wit: Beginning at a stone in the field on P. C. Westmoreland's line and running thence N 65 1/2 W 70.00 to P. O. Jones thence N 67 W 40.00 to P. O. Jones thence S 75 1/2 W 40.00 to a stake thence S 45 1/2 W 50.00 to a stake in the old Ponce de Leon road thence S 60 1/2 W 60.00 to angle S 71 1/2 W 30.00 to stake in Ponce de Leon road thence N 77 1/2 E 30.00 to Beginning corner containing Two hundred and twenty acres more or less bounded by the same and adjacent to the same

mines of valuable minerals which may be on said lands or any part thereof, to me and my heirs forever, and I also reserve the privilege of changing the course of the stream known as Gold Branch so as to use it for any purpose I may deem proper together with all and singular the rights, incidents, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining.
