

Branch Bottom from edge of Creek Bottom included and further agree to erect a house on said land by Jan the 1<sup>st</sup> 1882 said house to be ready or completed ready to dwell in. This contract to begin with the year eighteen eighty one (1881) and include 1882 and 1883 which will be three years and further I promise fire wood and board timber and Building timber for shelters off of housestead if it is not on said mentioned land. And J.P. McAllister of the second part agrees to deliver to W.V. Parkley one thousand lbs of middling link cotton in merchantable order on or by the first of November each year first to be delivered Nov 1<sup>st</sup> 1881 second 1882 third 1883 thus being the last and making in all three thousand lbs for the three years and promise to clean up and ditch out the Branch Bottoms and to till and take care of the place as best I can. This agreement to continue three years and remain binding when complied with by both parties. In witness whereunto we have both set our hands and seals this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of Sept 1880.

in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seventy three and 1/4 for Dollars to me paid by Alexander M<sup>r</sup> Bee of Greenville County in the State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released & by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Alexander M<sup>r</sup> Bee and heirs and assigns all that tract of land situate lying and being in the town

of Greenville and State aforesaid adjoining lands of Belle Robert J. B. Alexander. Tracts Nos 2 and 3 of Estate of William Rainey deceased beginning at a Pine 3 x 0 m thence N 30° E 50 fifteen chains to a Rock x 0 m thence S 42° E Seventeen chains and fifty links to a chumk stake 7 m thence S 30° W fourteen chains and eighty three links to a stake 7 m thence N 42° W seventeen chains and fifty links to the beginning corner and containing twenty five acres more or less being part of the lands of William Rainey deceased Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Alexander M<sup>r</sup> Bee his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Alexander M<sup>r</sup> Bee his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and all other persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this sixteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty and in the one hundred and fifth year of the sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
