To have and to hold, all and singular the said prem- ises before mentioned unto the said W A Henderson Guardian and his successors in office heirs and assigns forever, and to do hereby bind my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said W A Henderson and his successors in office heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs, lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
