Goodwin his desire that the said lands or any portion thereof should be sold and the proceeds of such sale reinvested in Personal Estate with like trusts as herein provided then the said W. D. Goodwin is hereby empowered to sell any portion of said lands and reinvest the proceeds thereof in Personal Estate with like trusts as herein provided for and to make a good and lawful deed therefor without the intervention of any Court. And I do hereby covenant with the said W. D. Goodwin that I will warrant and defend the said premises before mentioned and conveyed unto him in the manner herein stipulated against the lawful claims of any person claiming by, through or under me. Bishop his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Thomas T. Bishop his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and every other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
