Johnson (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Oliver P. Johnson all that tract or parcel of land, containing Fifty eight acres more or less, being the tract formerly owned by Sary Gosnell and Mary Gosnell and others situated in the State and County aforesaid on the north side of the meadows ford of Mush Creek branch waters of South River River, bounded as follows, on the west by Robert Pitman's land, on the north by the Charles Woods' land, on the East by the estate of Jeremiah Foxworth, and Alfred Turner on the South by the Benson Mill track, beginning on a white oak on agreed corner on the line of Robert Pitman and C.
