Vaughan all my interest in a certain piece, parcel or tract of land demand to Madam Walker by Elizabeth Fowler and Thos. R. Fowler, being one fourth interest in Ninety three and one half Acres, also one fourth interest in the Ten Acres mentioned in said deed.
