McCollough heirs and assigns forever, that said tract piece and parcel of land, with its appurtenances, and all the right title and interest which the said William Allison of right had therein and to the same to have and to hold the said piece parcel and tract of land with its appurtenances unto the said Joseph A. McCollough heirs and assigns forever as fully and absolutely as he, the said Perry D. Good of a certain title, interest and estate in and to all that piece or tract of land situate lying and being in the State and County aforesaid and having the following line, metes and bounds to wit: beginning at a Chestnut on the Pickens Road and running thence S. 60° E. 15 to a stake thence S. 30° E. 25 to a Black Oak on the Pickens Road, and thence with said Road to the beginning; also all my right title, interest and estate in, or to all that other piece or tract of land situate lying and being in the County and State aforesaid and having the following line, metes and bounds to wit: beginning at a stone on the Jones Gap Road and running thence N. 45° E. 12 to a Black Oak, thence S. 45° E. 9.70 to a stake, thence S. 60° E. 5.60 to a stone in said Jones Gap Road to the beginning; said two tracts containing in the aggregate thirty acres and six tenths of an acre, more or less and conveyed to Pleasant T. Good his Mother, Mrs. Julia Good, by deed bearing date the seventeenth day of Nov 1884, and conveyed to me by Mrs. Elizabeth M. Good, the widow of the said Pleasant T. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Norman Good and during the natural life of the said Norman Good, and upon the death of the said Norman Good by her present husband Warren G. Good, and the heirs and assigns of said Children forever, subject however to reservations in favor of Henderson Good before mentioned And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and defend and defend all and singular the said premises to the extent of my right title, interest and estate therein, unto the said Norman Good and during her natural life, and upon the death of the said Norman Good unto the children of the said Norman Good and their heirs and assigns forever.

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
