The State of South Carolina.

Dummermann, D. C. Ebaugh, J. M. Crosskey, O. F. Winters, did on the 31st day of January 1890, file with the Secretary of State, a written declaration, signed by them severally, setting forth:
 First: The names and residences of the said subscribers, to be E. D. Hallings, Luis Dummermann, and O. F. Winters of Charleston, S. C., D. C. Ebaugh, and J. M. Crosskey of Berkeley County, S. C.
 Second: The name of the proposed Corporation, to be that of "The Greenville Fertilizer Company"; the place at which it is proposed to have its principal place of business, in the County of Greenville, State aforesaid, and in or near the City of Greenville; the general purpose and nature of the business of the proposed Corporation, is the ginning of Cotton and ginning of Cotton seed, and all other substances and materials used in the manufacture of Fertilizers, the making of all such Chemicals & Acids, as is used in the Manufacture of Fertilizers, the mixing and Manufacture of Fertilizers of all and every kind and description, and the sale thereof, and of all such Materials and substances that may be used either in the making of, or separately as Fertilizers & Acids; The amount of Capital Stock, to be One Hundred Thousand Dollars, and the number of shares into which the same to be divided, to be Four thousand, of the face value of twenty five dollars each to be paid in money, labor or property (Real or Personal) at its money value, twenty five per cent at times of subscription, and the balance of Eighty five per cent at such times and amounts as the directors of said Corporation may see fit; The duration of the Charter to be for thirty years.

Hallings, and D. C. Ebaugh, were commissioned by me a Board of Corporation, authorizing and suspending them to draw Bonds of subscription to the Capital Stock of said proposed Corporation, giving not less than six days previous notice, by advertisement in a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, S. C., of the time and place where said bonds of subscription would be issued, and whereas, the said Board of Corporation on the sixth day of March A. D. 1890, did file with the Secretary of State their petition, setting over their signatures, certain things concerning the things, that fifty percent of the Capital Stock has been subscribed, and twenty percent of the amount so subscribed has been paid into the Treasury, and the remainder thereof has been secured to be paid, that a Board of seven directors have been elected, viz: O. F. Mills, D. C. Ebaugh, William Williams, Dummermann, D. W. Ebaugh, J. M. Crosskey, and T. L. Anderson, that said Board of directors elected, O. F. Mills as President, D. C. Ebaugh as Vice President, and E. D. Hallings as Secretary and Treasurer.

Now know ye O. F. Marshall, Secretary of State, by virtue of the Authority of me vested, by an Act of the General Assembly entitled: An Act to provide for the formation of certain Corporations under general laws, approved the twenty third day of December 1886, and all the amendments thereto, do hereby certify that said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their within declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their Charter, and that a copy of this Certificate be filed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Marine Conveyances, in each County where such Corporation shall have a business Office.
