McClanahan late of the County of Greenville and State aforesaid made and delivered a deed of conveyance of a certain tract of land in Greenville County and State aforesaid to one James M. McClanahan Trust for the use of one Annette G. Feaster his daughter

 1865 one Samuel B. McClanahan late of the County of Greenville and State aforesaid made and delivered a deed of conveyance of a certain tract of land in Greenville County and State aforesaid to one James M. McClanahan Trust for the use of one Annette G. Feaster his daughter

during the term of her natural life and after death in trust for the children of said Annette G. Feaster living at the time of her death and to be conveyed to them after the death of said Annette G. Feaster and whereas after that time the said tract of land was sold under the order of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County and the funds arising therefrom reinvested in the tract of land herein after described and whereas after that time the said James M. McClanahan was released as such trustee and Annette G. Feaster appointed as trustee and Annette G. Feaster appointed as trustee and his place and stead and whereas the said Annette G. Feaster thereafter died leaving her surviving as her only living children Samuel M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis and I now appoint as trustee in her place and stead with orders to convey the said lands hereinafter described to said Samuel M. Feaster and Harriet A. Davis the only children of the said Annette G. Feaster living at the time of her death Now therefore in order to carry out the provisions of the said trust and in obedience to the decree of the Court made in the case of Harriet M. Davis vs Samuel M. Feaster in the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County South Carolina on the day of April a. D. 1890 filed 19th April 1890. Now all men by these presents that I David P. Verner Trustee as aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of Five Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Samuel M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis (me Feaster) the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina known as the D. G. Mc. Clanahan home place less Forty one and one half acres deed to Elizabeth Johnson on the 19th day of April 1877. the said tract of land bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a stake in the road leading from Greenville to Chick. Bridge thence N. 34 E. 14.40 to a stake N. N. in branch thence S. 60 E. 8.50 to a heap of rocks S. 30 W. 14 to a corner near said road thence with said road to a corner in fork of road thence with small road to a stake in said road S. 71 W. 25.50 thence S. 55 W. 13 to a stake thence N. 60 W. 58.80 to a stake thence N. 58 E. 13 to a Spanish oak thence N. 50 E. 16 to a maple thence N. 20 W. 4.75 to a Black Gum thence N. 60 E. 100 to a stake in first fork said road thence with the meander of said road to the beginning corner containing one hundred and ninety two and one half acres and his and adjoining lands of Elizabeth R.
