Beginning at a black Oak & Wm. Cope's corner and running thence S. 1^o 45' E. 66' to a stone 8x4 m. on a road thence N. 1^o 45' E. 24.50' to a stone 8x4 m. on, on the branch, thence up the branch on a line 1.90' to a popular 3x4 m. thence S. 85' E. 11.65' to a stone 8x4 m. in Augusta road, thence S. 12^o 45' E. 8.20' to a bend in said road, thence S. 1^o 45' E. 5' onto a bend, thence S. 3^o 45' W. 4.40' to a stone 8x4 m. in the road.
