Verner, Master in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of one thousand and twenty dollars to me paid by the said A. P. Gilbreath and J. P. Charles, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said A. P. Gilbreath and

J. P. Gilbreath all that five acres or lot of land containing one hundred and two acres more or less situated in O'Neill Township, Greenville County, lying on waters of Beaufort Creek and bounded by lands belonging to Arthur Nevel, P. Montgomery, J. P. Anderson, and others and known as the Hardsell Gilbreath place.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments, and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them, in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under or by these or any of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said

A. P. Gilbreath and J. P. Gilbreath, heirs and assigns forever.
