Situate, lying and being at or near the same, in the County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, described as follows, to wit; Parcel 1: A strip of land 10 feet in width on either side of the center line of a certain industrial track, which springs from a certain side-track of the Railway Company, shown as the "middle track," at a point 12 1/2 feet east of the center line of the main track of the Railway Company, running between Atlanta and Charlotte, 537.5 feet south of milepost No. 487, and extending to the fertilizer works of the party of the first part; beginning at a point on the said center line of said industrial track, where the same is intersected by a line running parallel south and 100 feet distant from the center line of said main track of the Railway Company, and running thence northwesterly following the alignment of said industrial track for a distance of 604 feet, more or less, to the end of said industrial track;

Parcel 2: A strip of land 10 feet in width on either side of the center line of a certain industrial track, which springs from said "middle track" of the Railway Company, at a point thence 244 feet north of the point of connection of said above described track, and extends to and beyond the point of the party of the first part; beginning at a point on the said center line of said industrial track, where the same is intersected by a line running parallel south and 100 feet distant from the center line of said main track of the Railway Company, and running thence northwesterly following the alignment of said industrial track for a distance of 985 feet, more or less, to the end of said industrial track;

Parcel 3: Beginning at a point on the westerly limit of the present right of way of the Railway Company, 100 feet westerly of a point on the center line of said main track of the Railway Company, 981 feet north of milepost No. 487, and running thence: (1) northwesterly parallel south and at all times 5 1/2 feet distant from the center line of a certain other industrial track which springs from that certain tract, not above described, at a point thence 430 feet from the point of connection thence with the said "middle track" of the Railway Company, 273 feet, more or less, to the end of said industrial track; thence (2) easterly at a right angle 6.5 feet, to the westerly boundary line of said parcel 2, not above described, all being substantially as shown upon the blue-print hereto annexed and made a part of this instrument;

Having and Resolved, however, unto the party of the first part, the right to maintain its platforms and structures, as the same are now located upon the said parcels of land, as shown by said blue-print.

To Be Held To Hold, the said premises, with the appurtenances, unto the Railway Company, its Successors and Assigns, as right of way for use for railroad purposes, so long as it or they may require, the said right of way for the operation, maintenance and repair of said industrial tracks.

Upon Condition, however, that in the event that the Railway Company shall abandon the said industrial tracks, and in such event shall discontinue the operation of the same, and remove its property and fixtures therefrom, and from the right of way appurtenant thereto, then and in such event the said right of way herebefore granted shall be extinguished, ceased and determined.
