NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, J. W. GRAY, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the performance of the conditions aforesaid, and the payment of One hundred twenty four and 67/100 Dollars, by the said Richard A. Earle

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Richard A. Earle all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in Oaklawn Township in the County of Greenville, in South Carolina, containing fifty eight acres more or less, being a part of the tract containing 195.15 acres more or less conveyed to Edward I. Earle by J. W. Gray Master May 28th 1906, deed recorded in the R.M.C. Office in and for Greenville County in Book K.K.K. at page 192, beginning on an iron pin at mouth of a branch; thence N. 22-3/4 W. 12.00 to Poplar; thence again on line of tract No. 1 of said estate N. 36 E. 15.15 to an iron pin; thence along line of Jas. G. Hopkins N. 86-3/4 W. 19.00 to an iron pin on Reedy Fork Creek; thence down along the meanders of said creek to a maple; thence along line of tract No. 3 of said estate S. 74 W. 8.00 to an iron pin; thence S. 26-3/4 E. 10.80 along line of W. H. Massey to a stone and iron pin; thence N. 79 E. 21.50 on line of G. W. Sullivan to an ironwood on the side of Reedy Fork Creek; thence up said creek to the beginning corner.

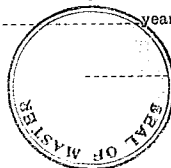
