the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said D. Arthur Pearson All that certain parcel or tract of land

lying, being and situate in the County and State aforesaid, containing forty-five acres, more or less, known as tract No. 5 in the partition of the lands of F.W. Pearson, deceased and having the following metes and bounds, to wit:

Beginning at a stone corner of Lot No. 4; thence N. 76 1/2 E. 40 chains crossing road to stake in Tiger River; thence with the meanders of said River 29.60 crossing a branch and Mush Creek to a stake at the intersection of South Tiger River with the old run of Mush Creek; thence with the line of said old run S. 25 E. to a stake; thence S. 20 W. 26.75 crossing Mush Creek and old road to a stone the beginning of corner as shown by plat of survey made by B.F.
