WITNESSETH, Whereas, the said party of the first part is indebted to said MECHANICS PERPETUAL BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATION in the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) Due.

weeks, the payment whereof the said party of the first part is anxious to secure:

Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, and in further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the first part has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said party of the second part all that certain piece, parcel and lot of land lying in Greenville County, in the State aforesaid, as follows, to-wit:

On ~~Echols~~^{Edgar Rock} Street between Burcombe and Pinkney
Street, bounded as follows: Beginning at an
iron pin on the west side of Echols Street,
corner of lot owned by John Jennings and
running thence with Echols Street S. 54-30 W.
forty-six feet nine inches to an iron pin, thence
N. 35-15 W. one hundred and fifty-three feet to
an iron pin corner of lot now or formerly
owned by W. B. Pollard, thence N. 54-20 E. forty-
eight feet, six inches to an iron pin in Jennings
line, and thence with Jennings line S. 35-15
E. one hundred, fifty-two feet to the beginning
corner, being the northern portion of a lot
conveyed to William G. Sirrine by Julia G.
Richardson on April 27, 1917, deed recorded
in book 42 at page 148.

And by William G. Serrine to me by his deed
dated the 26th day of May 1919, deed not
yet recorded.

In order to establish a common driveway between this lot and the remainder of the land Mr. Sirrine bought from Mrs. Richardson a strip five feet wide and sixty-five feet deep, has been reserved, together with a like strip from the adjoining lot now belonging to William G. Sirrine, so that there shall be established from Echoe Street midway between the two lots a driveway ten feet wide and sixty-five feet deep, to be for the common use of the owners of the two lots and no other persons. It shall not be obstructed but shall be kept open, unless it be closed by common consent of the two owners in writing.
