 and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said *Robert Gage, Receiver as aforesaid*

 all that piece, parcel, tract or lot of land situated in ~~Greenville~~ ^{1/2 mile S. E. of Greenville} four miles from Greenville
 bounded on the west side of White Horse Road,
 containing ninety acres, more or less, and having the

 made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, January 1916, beginning
 at a stake in center of White Horse Road, corner of
 tract heretofore conveyed by Julia D. Charles to
