

branch to stone; thence N. $29\frac{1}{2}$ E. 45.93, to stone; thence S. $62\frac{3}{4}$ W. 23.75."

Also, all that other tract of land conveyed to me by J. L. Martin by deed bearing date 17th day of February, 1917, said deed being recorded in R. M. C. office, Book 46, Page 290, and described as follows in said J. L. Martin's deed to me:

"All that Piece, Parcel or tract of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, Fairview Township, and having the following lines and bounds, to wit; Beginning at a stone wood 3X N. m., joint corner of E. B. Martin and A. W. Cox, and running thence N. 61.10 W. 26.20 chs. to a stone 3X, E. B. Martin's corner; thence S. 31-30 W. 34-50 chs. to a stone 3X (P. O. Stone), joint corner of E. B. Martin and Pling Brasier; thence S. 63-30 E. 33-10 chs. to a stone 3X N. m. joint corners of A. W. Cox and Frank Rice; thence N. 20 E. 34-30 chs. to the beginning corner and containing one hundred one and one half ($101\frac{1}{2}$) acres, more or less, and being the same tract of land conveyed to me by W. P. Hammond by deed bearing the date of Jan. 11, 1912, and recorded in Deed Book 17, Page 181, of R. M. C. Greenville County and State aforesaid.

Also, all that other tract of land conveyed to me by Lula Mae Turner by deed bearing date 16th day of June, 1924, and recorded in R. M. C. office, volume 83, Page 237, and described as follows:
