until paid in full all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for attorney's fee of one per cent.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents,

do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said The Peoples National Bank of Greenville, S.C. all my undivided right, title and interest, the same being a one-half interest, in and to all of that certain piece, parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being in the state and County aforesaid, in branch waters of South Tyger River and containing fifty-eight and one-half acres ($58\frac{1}{2}$) acres more or less, and having the following lines and bounds to wit: Beginning at a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m in branch and running thence down said branch to stone 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ m on John Parcs' line, thence with said line S. 75 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 35.79 chs. to stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence A. 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 16.58 chs. to stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence A. 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 2.84 chs. to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence A. 88 E. 5.60 chs. to a persimmon 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence S. 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 11.75 chs. to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence S. 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 10.10 chs. to a persimmon 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence N. 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 7.50 chs. to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m thence N. 81 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 12.10 chs. to the beginning corner 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ m bounded by lands of Jno.
