until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
 interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder
 hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

ten per centum

besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be

added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same to be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or of said
 debt, or) any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said
 note reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents,
 do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Mrs. Hettie A. Eskew:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land
 situate, lying and being in the state of South
 Carolina, county of Greenville and in Gant
 Township about six miles south of Greenville
 Court House and having the following metes
 and bounds: Beginning at a stone 3x n m
 in the White Horse Road and running thence
 S. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ East four chains along said road to a
 bend; thence South 31 $\frac{1}{2}$ East five chains
 along said road to a bend; thence South
 40 East Thirteen and 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains along said
 road to a stone in said road; thence North
 63 east four & 20/100 chains with a road leading
 into the Augusta Road; thence up the Augusta
 Road north 7 west five and 50/100 chains to a
 bend; thence up said road North 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ east seven
 and 25/100 chains to a stone in said road 3x n m;
 thence south 82 West Thirteen and 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains to
 the beginning containing 21 acres more or less.

Also, all that piece, parcel or lot of land, situate
 lying and being in state of South Carolina
 county of Greenville and in Gant Township
 on the Augusta Road, about seven miles
 from Greenville City containing 7,48 acres, more
 or less, and having the following metes and

 59 $\frac{1}{4}$ west eleven and 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ chains to center of Augusta
