WHEREAS, I, the said O. J. Hinton

in and by a certain note..... in writing, of even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to

in the full and just sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00)

Dollars, to be paid One year from date

with interest thereon from Maturity at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid Annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note..... to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note..... after maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of his interest to place, and the holder should place, the said note..... or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and either of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses, including 10..... per cent. of the indebtedness as attorney's fees, this to be added to the mortgage indebtedness and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land with the improvements thereon, situated, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Bates Township, and containing the following metes and bounds, according to a plat recorded in the R. M. C. Office for said Greenville County, State, in Deed Book E&E, page 301.

Beginning at a stone 3 ft. m. on old line, running thence N. 31 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 41.80 to a hickory 3 ft. m.; thence N. 19 $\frac{2}{3}$  W. 32.50 to a black-gum 3 ft. m.; thence S. 24.1 W. 15.40 to a small pine 3 ft. (one small sassafras); thence N. 88 $\frac{1}{3}$  W. 17.15 to a rock 3 ft. m. (Henry Evans Spring); thence S. 45 $\frac{5}{6}$  W. 33.05 to a Chestnut 3 ft.; thence S. 11 E. 27.00 to a stone 3 ft. m.; thence S. 20 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 12.68 to a red oak 3 ft. m.; thence N. 57 E. 25.37 to the beginning corner, and containing 255 acres, more or less, and being the same tract of land conveyed to J. T. Nally by R. F. Craig and Annie Craig by deed dated July 25, 1923, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for said Greenville County in Deed Book 97, Page 461.
