Beginning at an iron pin 3x on the North side of Rhett Street, on the line of the right of way of Southern Railway Company (being the connection Railroad between the Southern Railway depot and the Columbia and Greenville Railway depot); and running thence along said right of way N. 41-3/4 W. two hundred and seventeen (217) feet and seven (7) inches to an iron pin 3x (this line being at all times twenty-five feet from the center of said right of way) and running thence S. 72 W. one hundred and eighty-two (182) feet and six (6) inches along line of lot now or formerly belonging to F.
