"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Greenville Township, in Ward One of the City of Greenville, on Mulberry Street, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on Mulberry Street and Mulberry Alley, and running thence with Mulberry Street, N. 57-57 E. 50.5 feet to pin; thence S. 32-03 E. approximately 134.5 feet to pin on Piedmont Avenue; thence with Piedmont Avenue, S. 59-0 W. approximately 50.8 feet to an iron pin, corner of a 10-foot alley; known as Mulberry Alley; thence with said alley, N. 31-30 W. 134 feet to the beginning corner; being the Southern portion of Lot No. 1 as shown on plat made by R. E. Dalton in May, 1919.
